SALT CELL

CLEANING YOUR SALT CELL

Standard salt-water chlorinator cells need to be cleaned regularly. When the cell gets a build-up of calcium it goes white and this build up reduces the effectiveness of the cell, which could cause your pool to go green. The calcium will build up on only every second plate and the cell will need to be cleaned when it has this white build up or after 6 weeks, whichever comes first. Even self-cleaning chlorinators need to be cleaned at least every twelve months.

There is a special cell cleaner called Pure Blue Salt Cell Clean. The cleaner is reusable.

Some people clean their cell with hydrochloric acid because it is quicker but this will shorten the life of the cell. When you consider the cost of a new cell the small investment of the Pure Blue Salt Cell Clean is minimal.

To help prevent build up on your cell you can add Pure Blue Cal Kill every 6 months.
